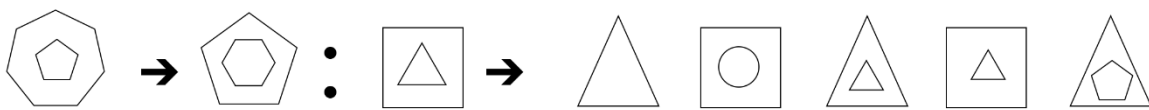
# Non-Verbal Reasoning

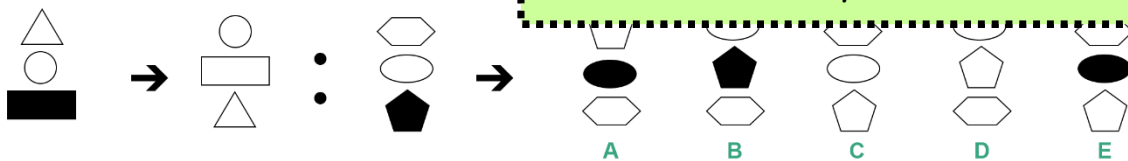

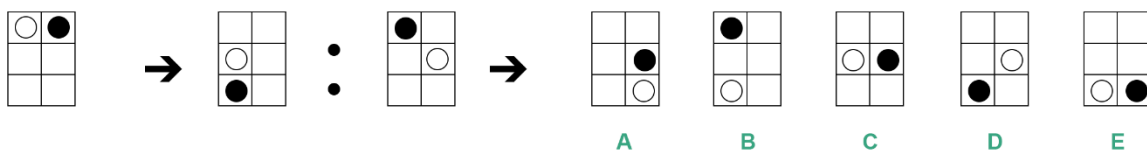
### Timed sections

### Practice 1:

Answer: C

Explanation: The driver **REVERSED** out of the parking space.

### Practice 2:

Answer: B

Explanation: The gardener was mowing the lawn.

### Practice 3:

Answer: C

Explanation: Indecisive is the opposite of emphatic.

### Practice 4:

Answer: B

Explanation: We can see that there is a 1 in each code. It is in positions 1,1 and 4. The only letter that is in these positions is L. So we know that L = 1. This means that code 3951 must = HAIL, as HAIL is the only word with L at the end (corresponding to the 1).

## Paper 2:

10. Tell your child "Paper 2 consists of a 5-minute Verbal Reasoning practice section, followed by a 20-minute Verbal Reasoning test".
  11. 2 minutes before Paper 2 is set to begin, tell your child "Paper 2 will begin in 2 minutes."
  12. At the time Paper 2 is set to begin, tell your child "Turn over your page and begin the Verbal Reasoning practice section. You have 5 minutes".
  13. Time this section for 5 minutes. After 5-minutes tell your child "That is the end of the Verbal Reasoning practice section please stop writing and prepare to begin the Verbal Reasoning test." Again, if they have finished this early it's important that they just wait until the time is up to start the next section.
  14. Wait a few seconds for your child to prepare themselves and then say "please turn over your page and begin the Verbal Reasoning test. You have 20-minutes to complete the VR test tell your child "You have five minutes left to complete the 20-minute VR test say, "that is the end of Paper 2 please stop writing and put your pen down".
- short and so we would recommend you move straight on from paper 2. Hand your child paper 3 and tell them "Paper 3 consists of two untimed subtests which each last 4 minutes. There is an untimed practice section at the beginning of each subtest. All answers should be marked on the answer sheet provided."
18. Tell your child "Turn over your page and begin the Subtest 1 practice section". This practice section is untimed, however, in all likelihood, in the exam, your child will only have a couple of minutes to look at this practice section. So, after no more than 4 minutes, tell you child "Please prepare to begin Subtest 1." Then after a few seconds tell them "You may now turn over your page and begin Subtest 1. You have 4 minutes."
  19. After 4 minutes tell your child "Please stop what you are doing and turn over the page to complete the practice section for Subtest 2".
  20. Again, after no more than 4 minutes, tell your child "Please prepare to begin Subtest 2" then after a few seconds tell them "You may now turn over your page and begin Subtest 2. You have 4 minutes."
  21. After 5 minutes tell your child "Please stop what you are doing and put your pen down. That is the end of the exam."
