M *Mock exam structure*

Every section of the mock exam starts with a front sheet like this. It outlines the structure of the mock paper which is the same as the exam itself. It is broken into two papers, both of which have answers provided at the end.

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Creative Writing Task

You have been asked to attend a meeting to discuss whether or not pupils should be allowed to wear alternative clothing to the governors about why pupils should be allowed to wear alternative clothing.

You should:

- present your stance clearly
- come up with 2-3 points for your alternative clothing policy.
- advise the governors on an alternative clothing policy.

Mock exam content

Each paper has the same subjects that you will find in the test itself. Paper 1 contains questions on Mathematics, Paper 2 contains a Creative Writing question

Remember to:

- Structure your piece correctly with an introduction, conclusion, and clear paragraphs.
- Check your spelling and punctuation.
- Include interesting vocabulary and varied sentence structures.



Timed sections

Each paper is split into short sections, as the real exam will be. Each section is timed in a similar way to the exam. This will give your child a very good feel for what they will face, even if on the day itself exam providers reduce or increase the number of sections or the splits.

Mock Papers Administration:

1. Set a date and time in advance to sit the mock paper (e.g., Next Saturday at 10:00am).
2. During the week remember to reference the upcoming date to build a little stress and tension. It is important children get used to the feeling of an approaching exam date.
3. The evening before, treat it as you would the actual exam. Think about early bedtime, relaxation, proper nutrition etc. Organise where the test will be taken the next day.
4. In the morning, treat it as you would the morning of the exam itself.
5. Read out the instructions as if you were the invigilator and follow the instructions throughout the test. These invigilation notes are provided for you.
6. If your child needs to go to the loo during the exam, they must be accompanied by you. The clock will not pause in the exam hall for a toilet break.

Invigilation notes

We take great care to provide detailed instructions and invigilation notes for every paper. This will enable your child to have a realistic mock exam experience from home.

Invigilator instructions:

Paper 1 – Maths

1. Your child should be sat at a desk with the Mock Exam Paper at least 5 minutes before the time set to start the exam. This is to allow time of emulating the actual exam and introducing the child to the tension that they will feel on the day of the real exam.
2. Tell your child, "This maths paper consists of 25 questions. You have 45 minutes to answer all of the questions. You should write your answers on the lined spaces provided. Remember to include units where possible".
3. 2-minutes before the time set to start the exam, tell your child, "the exam will start in 2 minutes". They can use this time to read through the instructions on the front page.
4. After 2 minutes, tell your child, "You may now turn over the page and begin the exam. You have 45 minutes".
5. After 25 minutes, tell your child, "You are just over halfway through the exam. You have 20 minutes remaining".
6. 5 minutes before the end of the exam, tell your child, "you have 5 minutes remaining".
7. After 45 minutes, tell your child, "that is the end of the exam. Please stop writing and put your pen down".
