Timed sections

Section 3: English

Q1

C. She paused, heard a faint rustle from between the shelves, and pushed the door a little wider.

This is the best continuation because it responds directly to the surprising detail in the first sentence: the door is open even though the library is supposedly closed for repairs. Nora hearing a rustle and cautiously opening the door develops the mystery in the immediate moment.

Option A is relevant because it explains why the repairs began, but it moves into background information too soon. The first sentence creates tension about the open door, so the best continuation should follow Nora's response to that situation.

Option B is plausible because it connects to the sign, but it jumps ahead and explains the situation before the scene has developed. It also removes some of the mystery created by the open door.

Option D tells us something about Nora's feelings towards the library, but it does not explain why the door is ajar or move the present action forward.

Answers and explanations

The correct answer for every question can be found on the answers page, and where necessary, we have provided a step-by-step solution for extra guidance on tricky questions.

ant or not eager to do something. In the sentence, before answering, which shows that she does not seen. The most opposite meaning is therefore willing, which means ready or prepared to do something.

Option A, nervous, is tempting because the witness may well be nervous. However, nervous is not the opposite of reluctant. A person can be both nervous and willing.

Option C, frank, is also quite close because it means open or honest. However, it does not directly oppose reluctant. Someone can be frank once they speak, but still reluctant before doing so.

Option D, prompt, links to the idea of answering without delay, which contrasts with the witness pausing. However, it is about speed rather than willingness. The best opposite of reluctant is willing.

11 Plus Mock Exam Information-FSCE

Mock Papers Administration:

1. Set a date and time in advance to sit the mock paper (e.g., Next Saturday at 10:00am)
2. During the week remember to reference the upcoming date to build a little stress and tension. It is important children get used to the feeling of an approaching exam date.
3. The evening before, treat it as you would the actual exam. Think about early bedtime, relaxation, proper nutrition etc. Organise where the test will be taken the next day.
4. In the morning, treat it as you would the morning of the exam it!
5. Read out the instructions as if you were the invigilator and follow throughout the test. These invigilator instructions are below.
6. If your child needs to go to the loo during the exam, keep the clock. The clock will not pause in the exam hall for a loo break.

Invigilation notes

We take great care to provide detailed instructions and invigilation notes for every paper. This will enable your child to have a realistic mock exam experience from home.

Invigilator instructions:

Paper 1:

1. Your child should be sat at a desk with Paper 1 in front of them before the exam. This is an important part of emulating the actual exam, introducing your child to the feeling of tension that they will feel in the exam.
2. Tell your child "Paper 1 consists of a 10-minute spelling test, followed by a 30-minute comprehension test, and a 5-minute vocabulary test. Each section starts with an explanation of what to do, followed by a worked example and solution. All answers must be marked on the separate answer sheets provided."
3. 2 minutes before the time you have set to begin the exam, tell your child "The exam will begin in 2 minutes."
4. At the time set to begin the exam, tell your child, "You may turn over the page and begin the Spelling practice section".
5. This section is untimed but shouldn't take more than 5 minutes, so after around 5-minutes tell your child "That is the end of the English practice section please stop writing and prepare to begin the English test." If they have finished early, it's important that they wait to proceed, as this is what they will experience on the day.
6. Wait a few seconds for your child to prepare themselves and then say "please turn over your page to begin the spelling section. You have 10-minutes to complete this section".
7. After 5 minutes, tell your child "You have five minutes left to complete this section"
8. At the end of the 10-minute spelling test say, "that is your time for the spelling section up, please stop writing and prepare for the comprehension practice section".
9. Wait a few seconds for your child to prepare for the next section. Then say "please turn over the page and begin the comprehension practice section".
10. Again, give your child around 5 minutes to complete this section. After 5-minutes, tell your child "That is the end of the comprehension practice section. Please stop writing and prepare to begin the comprehension test." Again, if they have finished this early it's important that they just wait until the time is up to start the next section.
